Estimates requested from different play equipment providers for supply and install of products.

**Match funding agreed by Highways (made available in April) to support implementation of play street proposals for permanent equipment and greening.**

Sketch design in development.

## **November 2021:**

Sketch plan to be agreed and finalised.

Plan shared with local community for feedback (volunteering opportunities).

Request quotations for delivery of scope of works.

Assess best options for implementation. Finalise implementation plan – scope of works for different suppliers/ contractors.

Integrate any feedback if necessary.





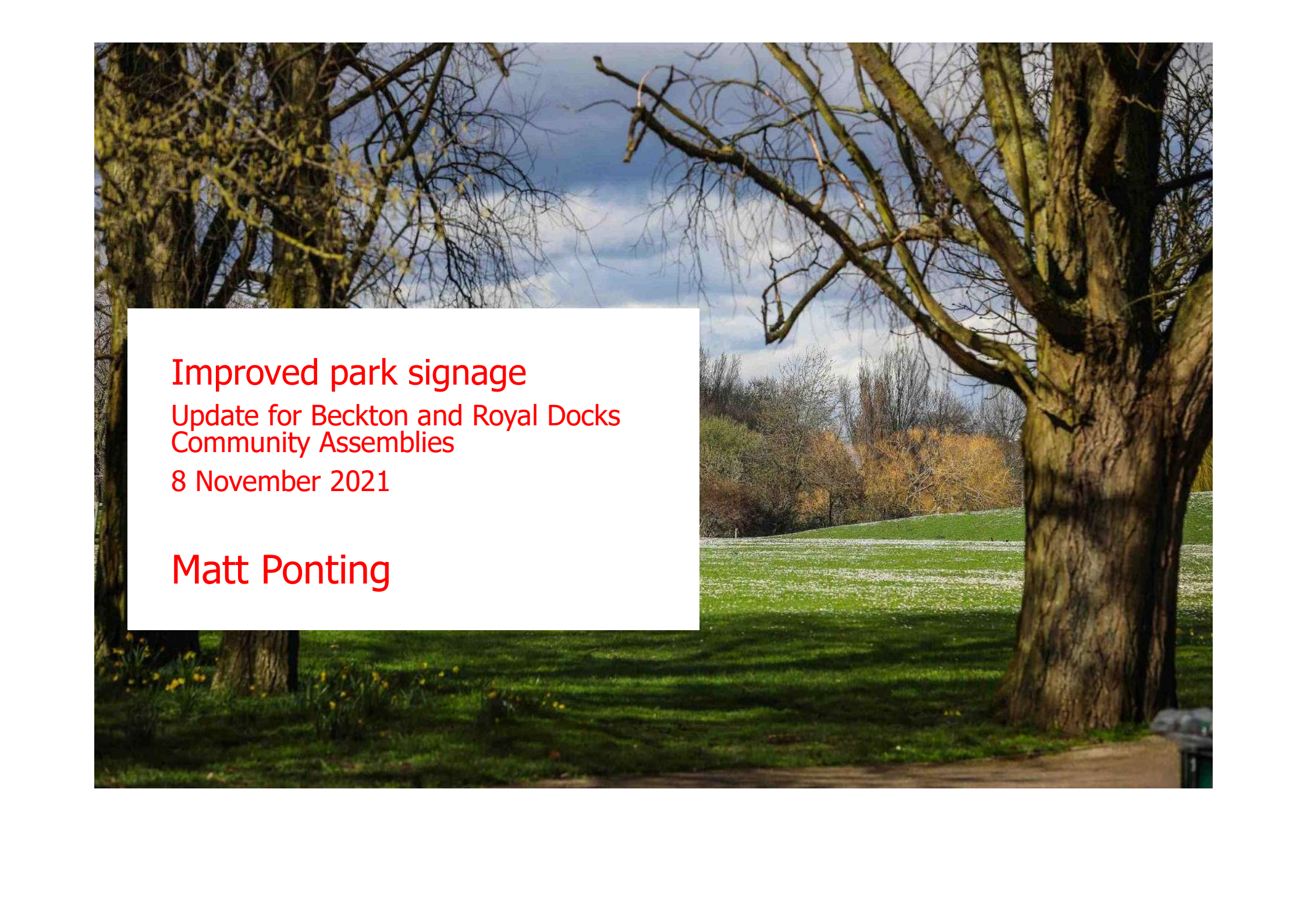

## Printing and installation – Smaller signs

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The new signage will be printed on weather and graffiti proof vinyl, with a UV protected laminate finish. I recommend to remove the glass, as this has become scratched over time. The black posts could be painted, though this will require approval. Addition of accessible features for disabled people, to be researched in initial phases.



## Printing and installation – Larger signs

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This signage has noticeboard information, so will need to have a different printed solution. I will need to speak with parks about the rationale for the notices and how frequently they are changed.
