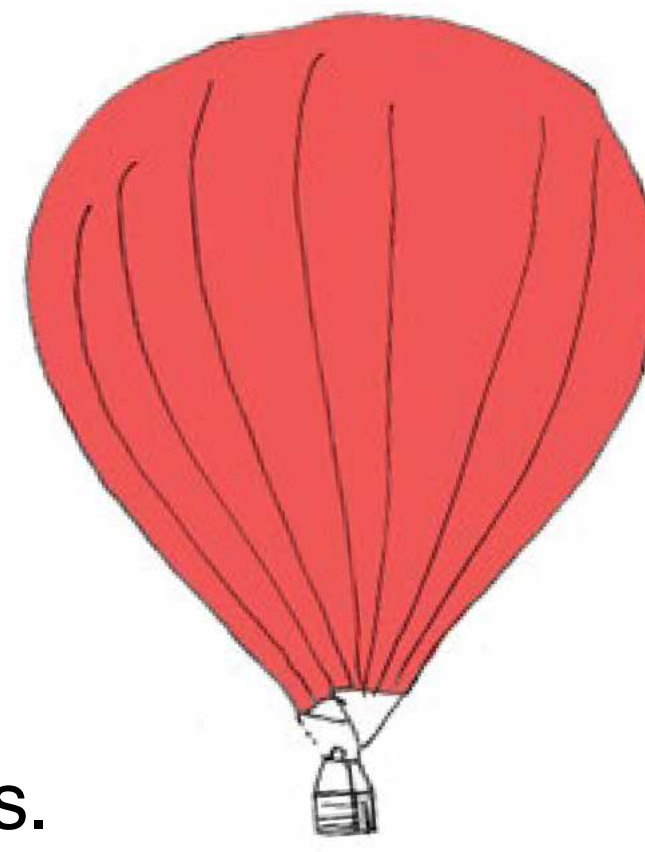

What's this event all about?

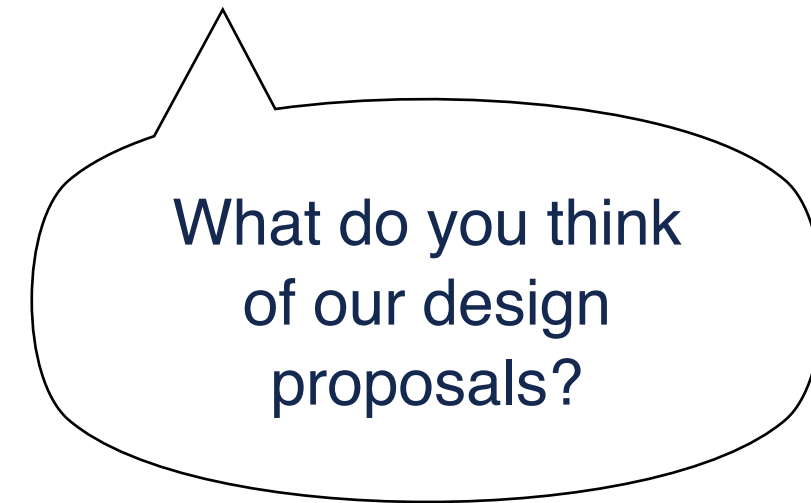


Beckton Parks Masterplan is one of London's most ambitious urban green space projects. Co-designed with local communities, it sets out a vision for investment and improvement in 36 hectares of Newham parkland to support wellbeing and activity.

Architects East, who drew up the Masterplan, are now working on early projects in key locations to address community priorities around safer routes and better play, sports and leisure.

Beckton Sports & Play Vision - Masterplan

Sports and Leisure Hub

East Architects are working with Newham's Parks Service to develop designs for the Sports and Leisure Hub outside Will Thorne Pavilion, which is currently being refurbished. Designs will include new urban play, a 'PlayZone' MUGA, informal sports and recreation areas and a new lit pathway with seating, in line with the Masterplan's Community Vision for the area.

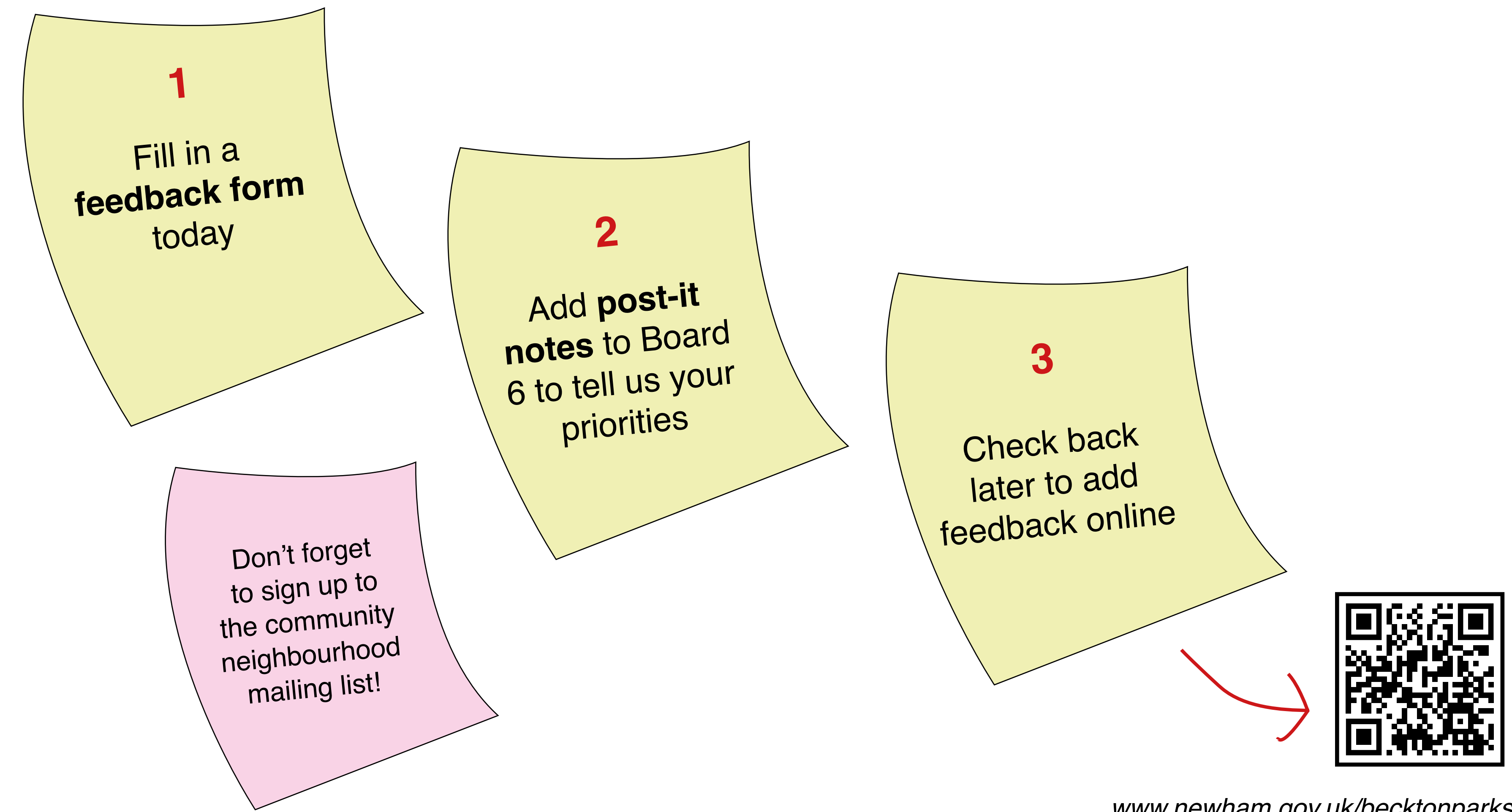


Works have begun on Beckton Corridor

Beckton Corridor

East are also working with Newham's Highways and Parks Services to design entrances and special features for the Beckton Corridor walking and cycling route, which is currently being widened and resurfaced. The designs will draw on principles set out in the masterplan and on the design of the entrance to the Queen Elizabeth Memorial Pathway in Beckton Meadows, which was opened earlier this year.

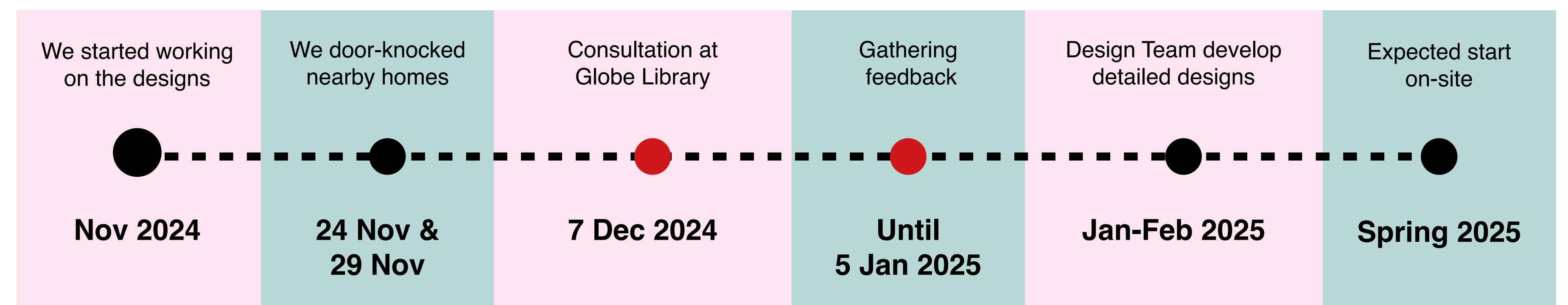

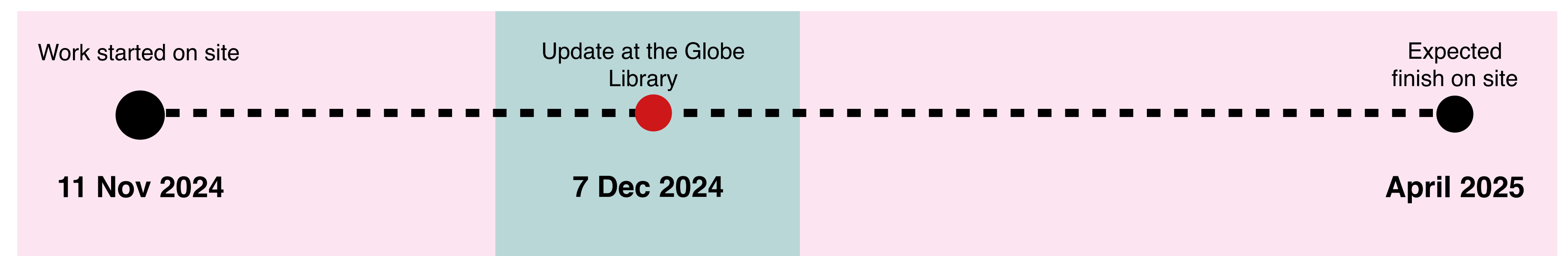
Sports and Leisure Hub Timeline

Beckton Corridor

Beckton Corridor is an important pedestrian route, separated from car traffic, connecting Beckton DLR to residential areas, Beckton Park and Royal Albert Way.

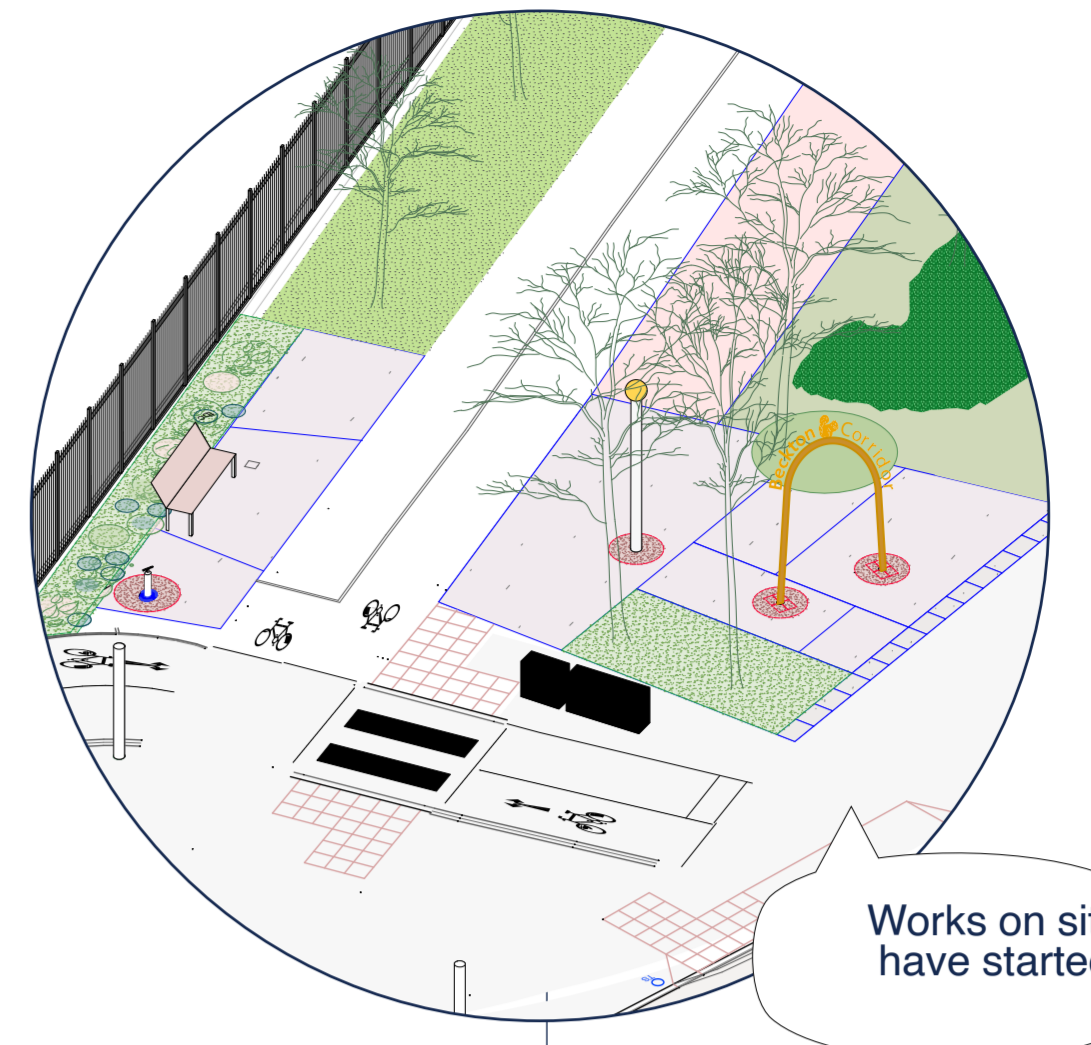
A clear vision for the safe, attractive Corridor was set out in the Masterplan. This is now being brought to life.

What's happening?

- Segregated walking and cycling surfaces along a widened path - Newham Council consulted on different options for this at the end of 2023 to identify the best solution.
- Improved entrances, highlighting the unique and special character of the Corridor
- Updated lighting and CCTV
- Play-on-the-way areas along the route to allow children to enjoy travelling along the corridor.
- Outdoor fitness trail as proposed by residents during the development of the masterplan



Archway signage at entrance from Asda/Bus Station and from DLR

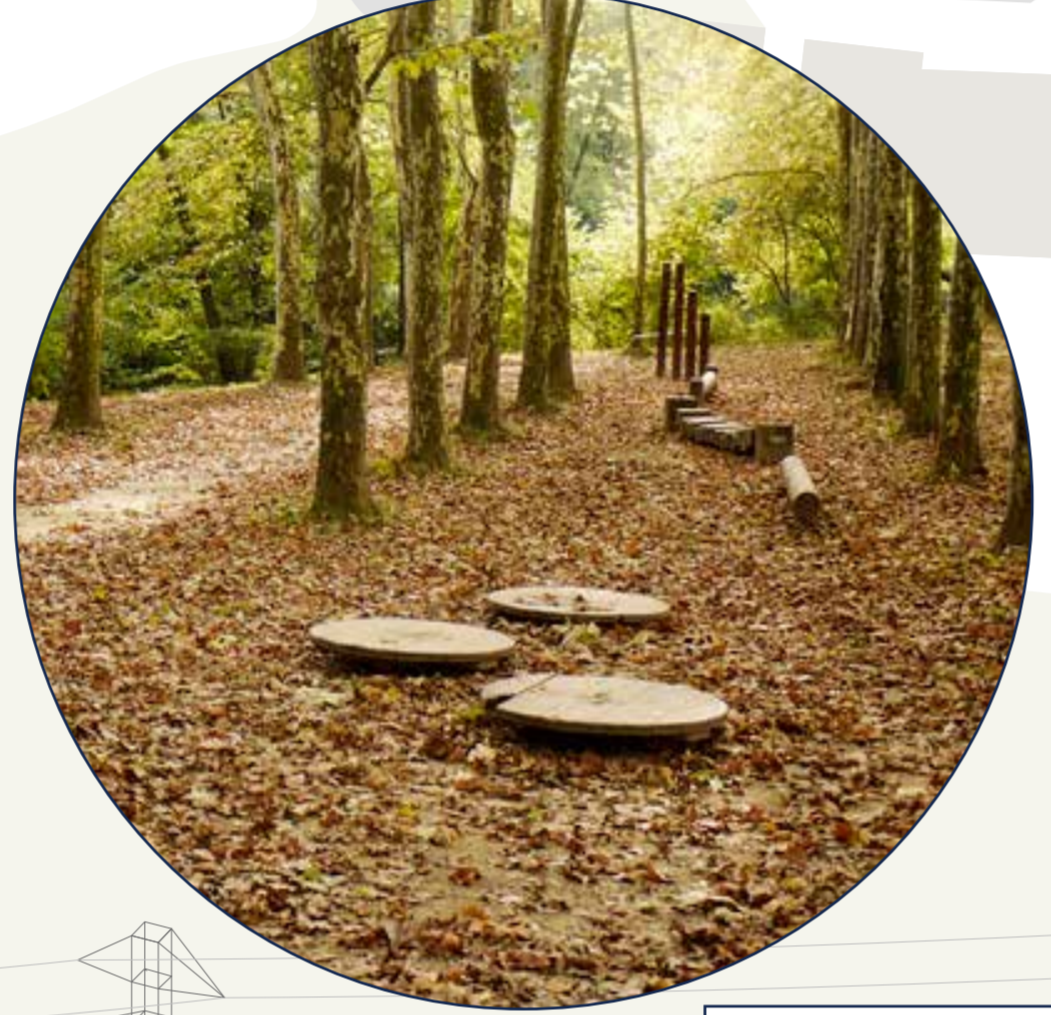

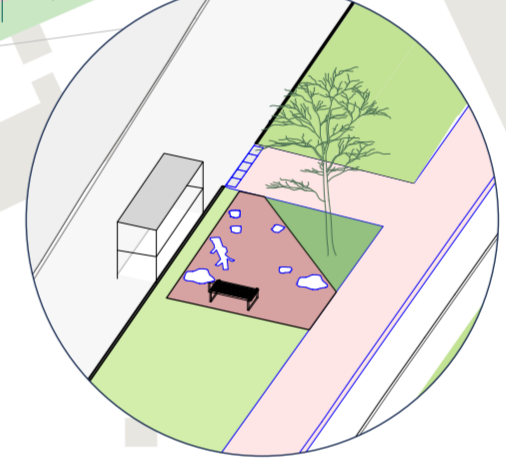

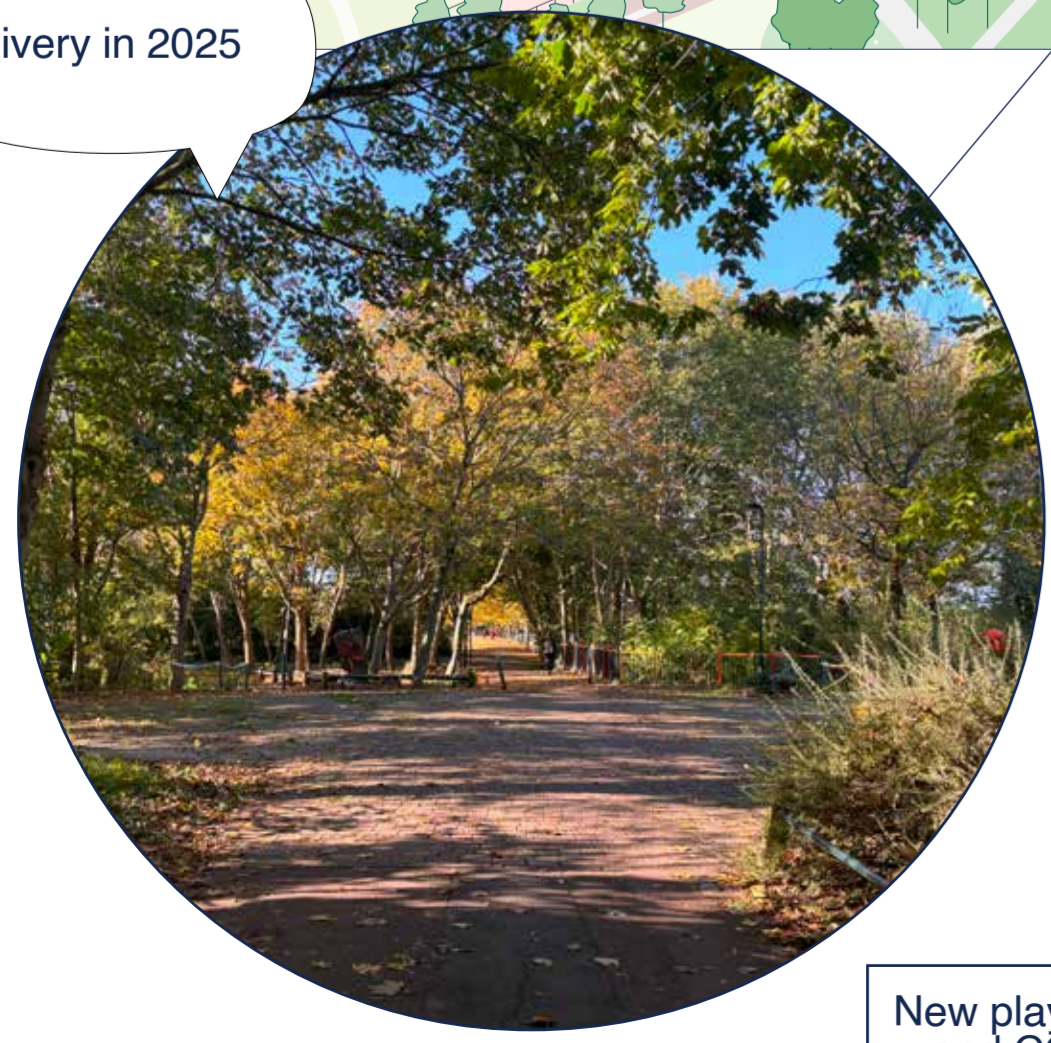

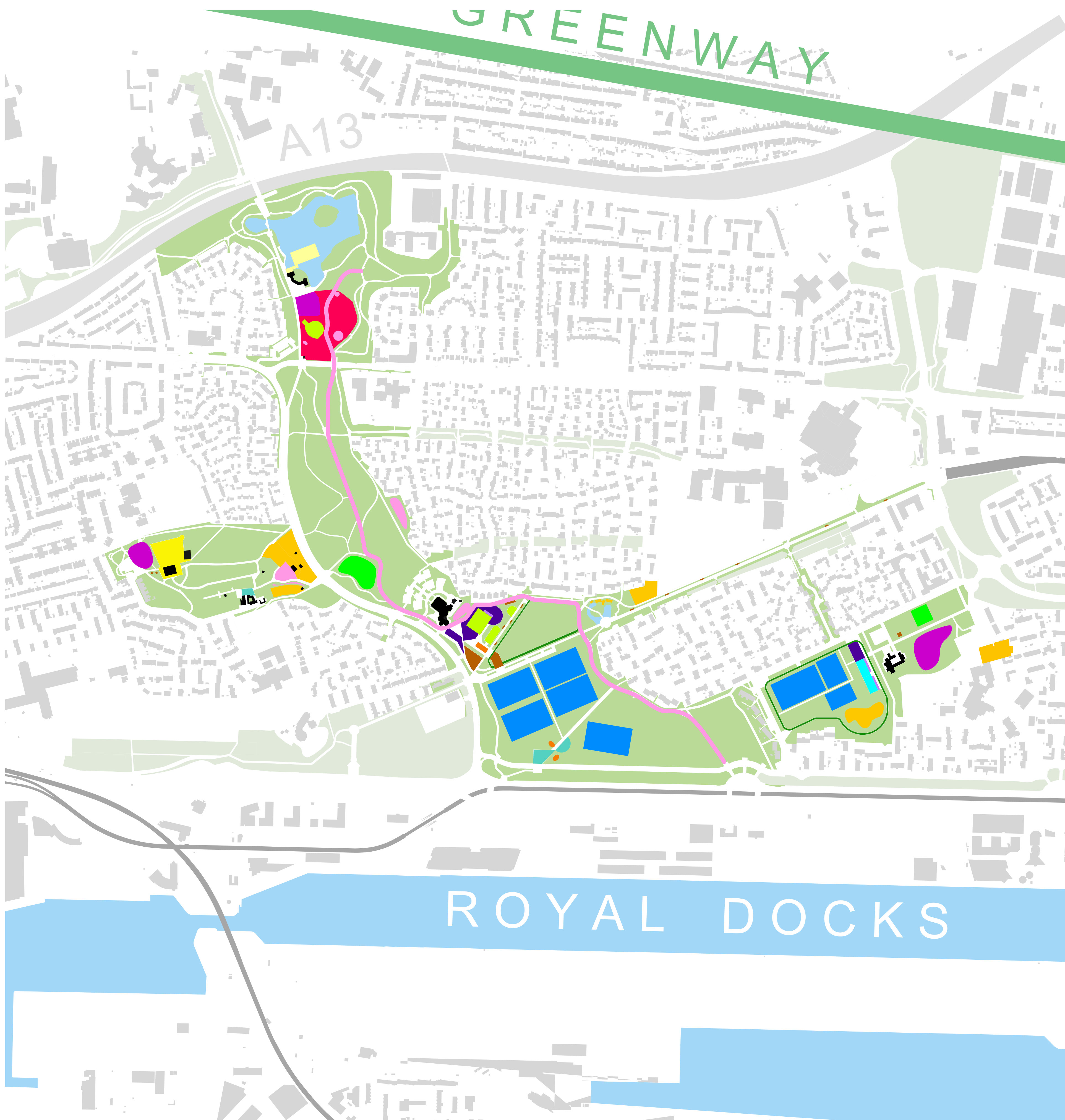

The Starting Point for Designs

Co-design workshops in 2022 led to a **Vision for a Sport and Active Leisure Hub around Will Thorne Pavilion** and in the green areas in front of it.

Our task now is to turn that Vision into Detailed Plans. While some aspects may need to adapt in response to new information, resident feedback, available funding etc. It's vital that we stay true to the Vision and to agreed community priorities.

Emerging Design Proposals

Turning Vision into Reality Now!

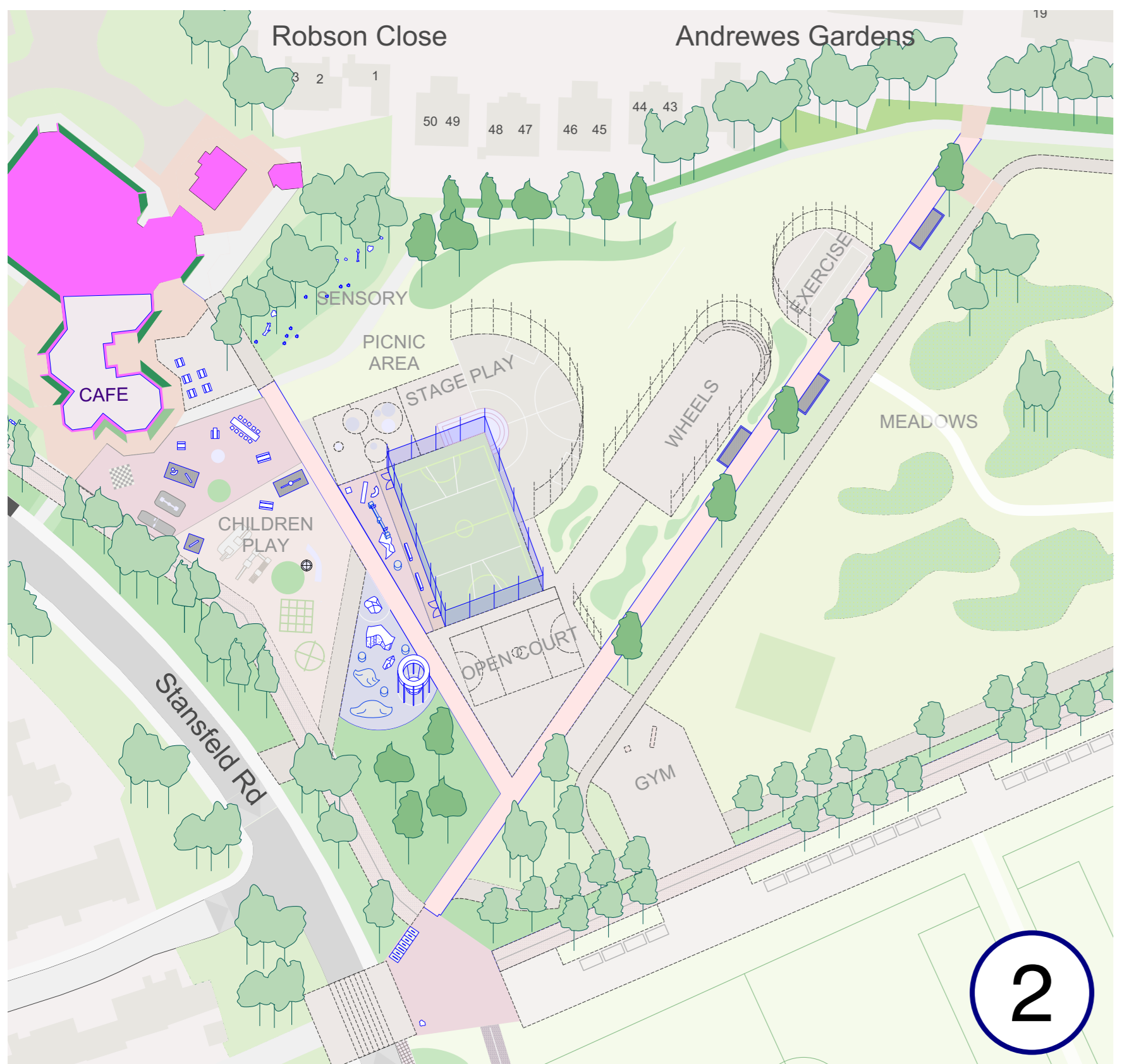
The Parks Service currently have an opportunity to work with the Football Foundation, to install a PlayZone MUGA and have also secured some capital funding that can be spent on:

- A new path, with lighting and seating, connecting Stansfeld Road to Andrewes Gardens along the existing 'desire line'.
- A new Urban Play & Sports area with bouldering and wheeled play

We've therefore re-organised the design to (1) prioritise those features, and (2) allow other aspects of the Vision to then be added seamlessly in future phases. The existing play area will be replaced as part of the future works.
