The area currently consists of a few planters and a some benches. The aim of the project is to turn the open space into a community garden for local residents. Currently there is no local greenspace for the residents to have access to do their own gardening or any outdoor social space for them to use outside their flats. The space would be turned into a pop-up garden with additional planters and trellises for residents to be able to grow their own fruit, vegetables, flowers and climbers as well as a green house. Also adding to additional seating with benches and a covered area so residents can use the space for personal and social gatherings. Investing in this open space would greatly enhance quality of life for the elderly residents and its visitors, build on community cohesion and bond with nature. 	Imraan Miah	Stondon Walk: Community Project	Our proposal: * Added greenery (planters) * Landmark, Iconic murals & Intergenerational activities * Increased street lighting For Local Residents: The local residents have called on the Council and the Mayor of London to do something about the crime in Abbots Road/ Stondon Walk. Tragically a young man lost his life on the 29th of December 2020, and the community do not want his death to be in vain. The community have had a number of complaints for decades about the area, this includes fly-tipping, drugs, urination and violence. Along with the Councils CCTV, there are other ways that crime can be "designed out" to make our area safer for local people. That is why we are asking for you to vote this project through. For The Wider Community: Stondon Walk and Abbots Road is a vital public walkway that connects the surrounding streets to Barking Road. However, the crime, flytipping and general feel of the area mean that residents, especially women, do not feel safe. The Met Police have helpfully compiled the crime statistics which show this is a hot spot. This means the activity happening in Stondon Walk and Abbots Road can spread. By helping us to make the area better, you are showcasing what we can do, and help us to be the pilot for other areas - maybe even yours. We propose four key activities to support investing in Green Spaces, Community Safety & Cleaner Environment 1- Turning Plants into Art - targeting residents without access to a garden, our highly talented terrarium artist will deliver 3 courses @ 2 sessions (6 workshops) each for up to 45 residents (young people, adults and older people) to create a living work of art. These unique workshops will give residents the insight into a practice that has the power to transform cityscapes and indoor living, bringing the power and beauty of the natural world into our homes. 2- Greening Green St Workshops & Competition - for residents to learn various urban gardening skills and techniques. Each of the 10 workshops will cover different themes and is designed to give you all the information you need to start a garden in an urban area. Not only will you be ready to create a garden from scratch, you will know how to keep up and expand your garden year after year. We have created these workshops to help you understand what creating an urban garden entails and how to care for the garden you create. All sessions will be uploaded onto Rosetta's YouTube channel so that they can go back to the course content and for those that cannot attend in person can also take part. We will encourage volunteers to work with residents. We will then encourage participants to improve their front gardens and enter into a prize winning competition. We will reach out to mainstream press channels for eg the BBC to bring some high profile names to Green St! We expect to work with up to 100 residents. 3- Nature Arts - fun and creative programming so that all of the family can get involved! A range of workshops from botanical drawing classes and pressed leaf art to stone painting and nature photography. We expect to work with up to 180 -200 residents (children, young people, families). 4- Mindful Arts & Nature - We will create a pack from our flagship Mindful Arts programme. Each pack will encourage mindfulness practice and creativity through the theme of nature, helping residents to improve focus, reduce stress and build confidence to appreciate and explore their environment. These will be free and contain everything they will require and will be posted to residents. We expect at least 150 residents will benefit from these packs (adults and older people). Green Street has high levels of traffic and minimal greenery, making it a challenging environment for pedestrians and cyclists to navigate comfortably despite its busy atmosphere and high footfall. Through the Green Street Pocket Park Initiative, the area can be strategically transformed to host a variety of portable, moveable micro-parks full of greenery, seating, and traffic calming all in one. They are designed to provide cycle parking too. And each one only takes up the size of a single car parking space. Each Pocket Park will provide inclusive seating designs that are accessible for all mobility needs, and offer a breath of fresh air (literally) for anyone needing to take a seat. Beyond the additional green space and public realm improvements, the Pocket Park Initiative will work with Newham community groups to provide chances for local schools, allotments, and volunteer organisations to cultivate and maintain the micro-spaces for gardening and growing, adding additional community benefits to each Pocket Park. This project aims to bring much needed greenery to Green Street by planting trees and the placement of planters with attractive wildflower planting arrangements along our busy high street. The benefits are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>· Improved air quality by adsorbing pollutants, intercepting harmful particulates from smoke, pollen and dust and releasing oxygen through photosynthesis, thus reducing the incidence of diseases exacerbated by air borne pollutants.</li> <li>· Just looking at trees has been proven to lower a person's blood pressure, reducing stress and promoting community wellbeing.</li> <li>· Lower temperatures by providing shade for buildings and people and transpiration cooling (trees release water into the atmosphere) during increasing extreme heat events.</li> <li>· Reducing the impact of climate change, by drawing down carbon into the soil.</li> </ul> <p>The more areas of land covered by concrete, tarmac and paving slabs the greater the risk of surface flooding.
