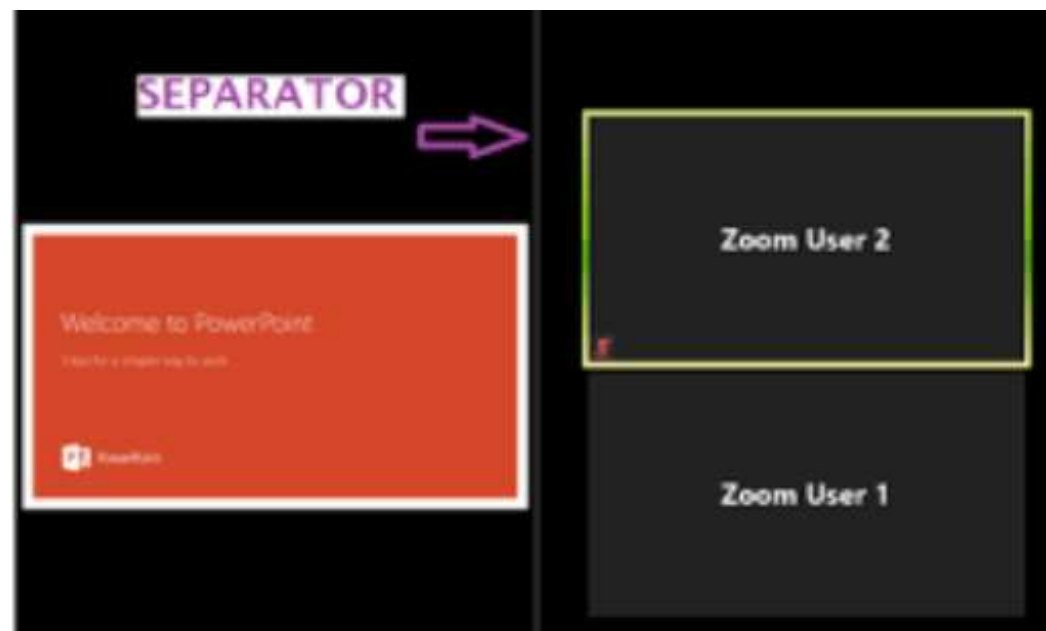
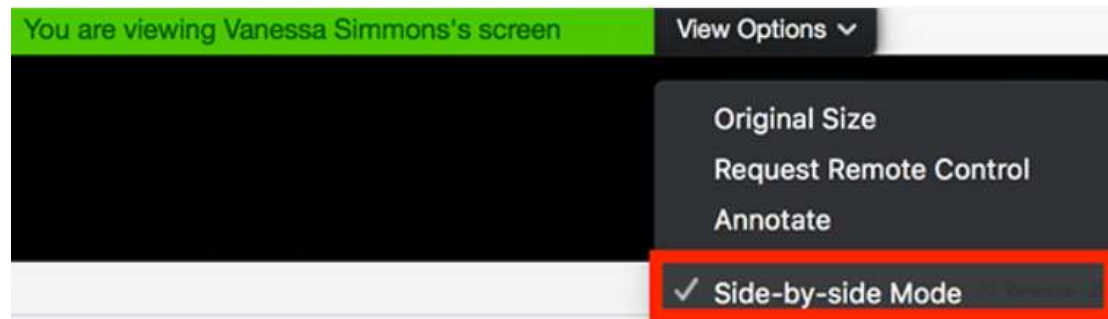
Click on '**View Options**' at the top of the screen

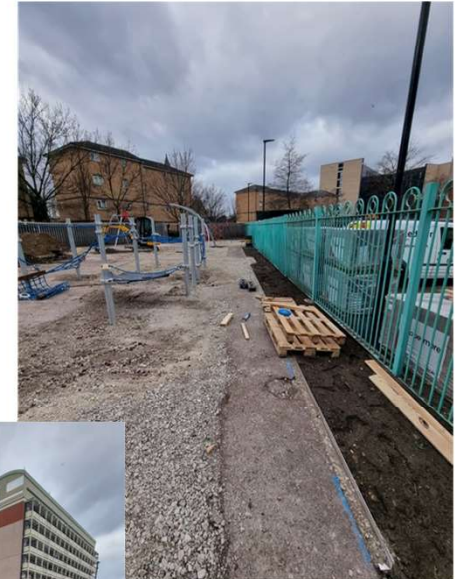
Highlights:

We're excited for the project completion by 31 March and will be working with Mo the local community gardener, VIY and RDLAC to begin to engage volunteers for planting in April 2022.



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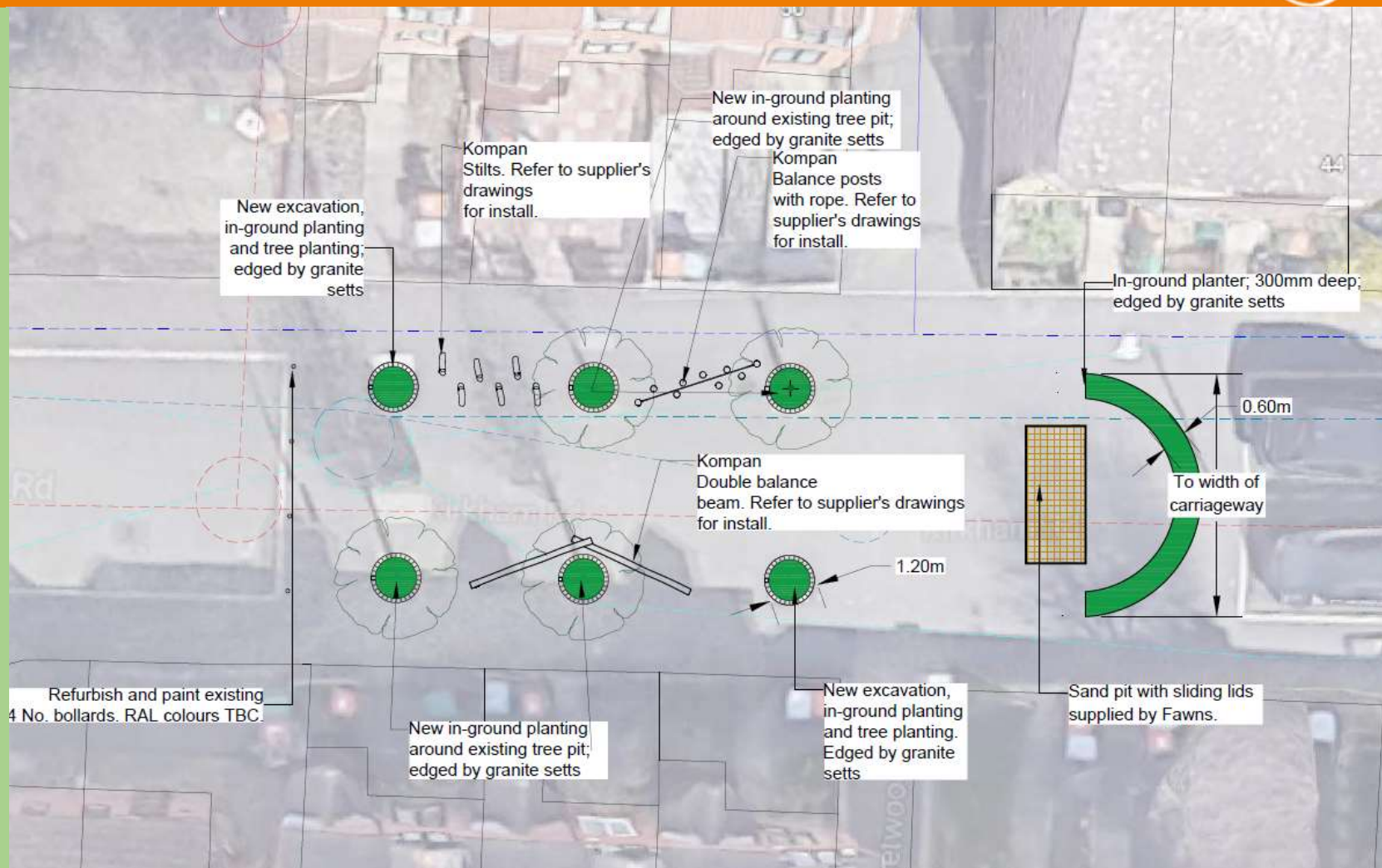

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NEWHAM'S APPROACH TO YOUTH SAFETY



KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE:

In Newham, we offer a range of support and services to help keep our children and young people safe. Our key offers are:

Childrens' Social Care and Early Help:

Services are available 24/7 to support safeguarding and welfare concerns for children and young people who may be at risk due to exploitation, going missing from home or care or other concerns.

Newham Family Information Service (FIS):

Services that support children, young people and their families in Newham.

Newham Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence Support Service:

A confidential support service for all genders ages 16+. Providing support for all forms of domestic abuse and sexual violence.

Rescue and Response Service:

This service supports young people across London up to 25 years old, who are involved in or affected by "county lines" activity.

Newham Youth Zones:

Youth Zones are safe and welcoming spaces open to all children and young people
